<u>Auburn Elementary</u> is a Transitional Kindergarten through fifth grade school located in the north area of town. The school opened in July of 1995 on a multi-track, year-round schedule. In 2001-02 the school returned to a traditional schedule. The school features a complete library, up-to-date computer lab, life lab garden area, playground shade/misting area and a courtyard pavilion area.

Rock Creek School, located in North Auburn, was selected as a California Distinguished School in 1997. This singular distinction reflects the ongoing commitment that is shared by parents and staff to ensure that all students are successful, lifelong learners. Although Rock Creek School was originally built in 1965, the classrooms and computer lab were modernized in 2003 followed by the administration building and multipurpose room which were completed in 2006. The school serves Preschool through fifth grade students. Partnerships between school and community organizations offer additional programs such as the Life Lab and Community Garden, Power Hour – After School Tutoring (in partnership with the Boys and Girls Club).

One of the distinguishing characteristics is the central park-like quad bordered by the library, multi-purpose room and classrooms.
